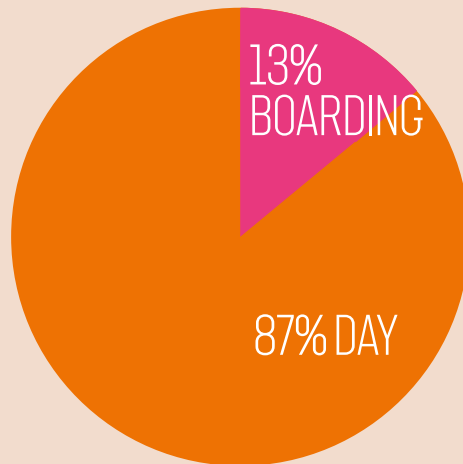

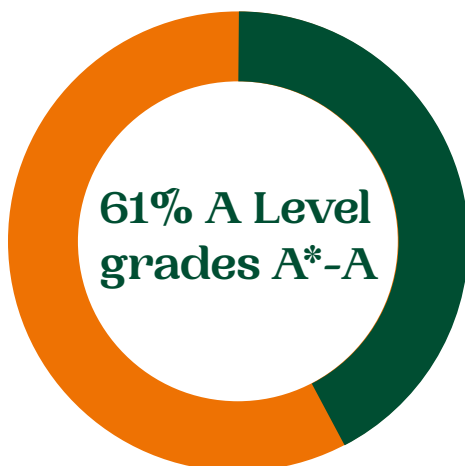

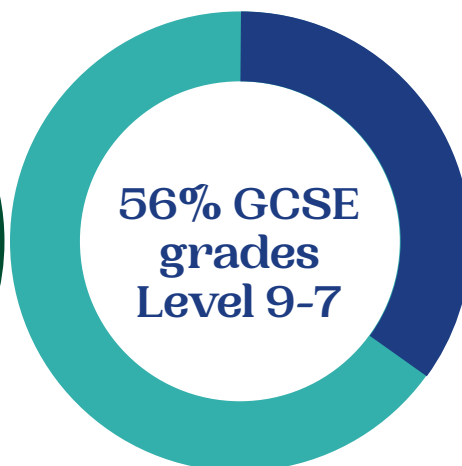

Prep School

- ➔ International students can join as day students up to age 11 (Year 6). Boys can join all year groups as day students in the Prep School.
- ➔ The Prep School prepares students for a secondary school education with many Prep School girls moving into Kent College Senior School at Year 7.
- ➔ Students are taught by their form tutors and with specialist teachers for Music, Drama, PE and French.
- ➔ International students receive EAL support to help them develop their English skills.





Senior School

- ➔ Entry into the Senior School is from age 11 (Year 7) until age 16 when students complete GCSE examinations at the end of Year 11.
- ➔ **Year 7 and Year 8** (starting ages 11–12). Students study a wide range of subjects taught by specialist teachers. Subjects include Maths, English, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, French, Spanish, Computer Science, Music, Drama, Art, PE and EAL. Internal examinations are held at the end of each year.
- ➔ **Year 9** (starting age 13). Students continue to study a wide range of subjects and will select two language options (EAL, French, Spanish, Latin and Classics) and two creative arts options (Art, Music, Food Tech and Textiles). Internal examinations are held at the end of each year.
- ➔ **Year 10** (starting age 14). Students will study a two-year GCSE programme with formal GCSE examinations at the end of Year 11.

Sixth Form

- ➔ Students join the Sixth Form at age 16 into Year 12.
- ➔ We offer 2-year A Level, BTEC or AAQ courses or a 3-year Sixth Form Foundation Programme.
- ➔ There are a wide range of enrichment opportunities through the Honours Programme:

ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITY

At Kent College, we view every student as an individual learner with their own strengths and passions, and offer a wide range of GCSE and A Level options to meet every interest. 1-Year GCSE (Year 12)

For the 1-year GCSE students will study up to 6 GCSE's. Subjects will be taught by specialist teachers with practical lessons where appropriate.

This flexible, individualised approach to GCSE and A Level study is ideal for students aged 15 or 16 whose English may not yet be ready for Sixth Form or who lack the GCSEs required for UK university entry.

SHORT TERM STUDY PROGRAMME

International students seeking to improve their English and experience a British education can join our short term study programme. Students can stay from one to six weeks for an intensive English programme, or one term to one year. We offer this in Years 7-10.

All international students will be integrated into mainstream lessons and have three one-hour English as a Additional Language lessons each week. This can be changed subject to the progress a student makes. They are taught EAL in one-to-one or in small groups where they can practise their English with other international students. All their subject lessons will be with British students and they will follow the timetable for their year group. At the end of their stay they will receive a study report.



Cultural Experience

Students are able to understand British culture and history through excursions to heritage sites, museums, trips to London as well as to the many local attractions.

Boarding

Short term stay students are full boarders and are encouraged to take advantage of all the extra clubs and activities after school and at weekends. These activities enrich their experience, allow for opportunities to interact with day and boarding pupils across the school and become fully involved in school life.



INTERNATIONAL STUDY PROGRAMME

The International Study Centre is at the heart of the school where international students have English as an Additional Language (EAL) lessons with a team of specialist teachers. Depending on their level of English, students will receive a programme of EAL support designed to help them make fast progress to access the British curriculum. Students are taught in small groups or one-to-one, and EAL teachers work closely with subject teachers to ensure each student's EAL support is tailored to help them succeed.



EAL Programmes

Standard

- ➔ Students will have up to three one-hour lessons each week and the option to increase if more lessons are needed.
- ➔ Years 7–9: Students follow the mainstream curriculum and chose one language from French and Spanish if they wish.
- ➔ Years 10–13: Students study their chosen subjects. It is possible to study a reduced number of subjects at GCSE, if needed.

Enhanced

- ➔ Students will attend mainstream lessons and will also have extra EAL support. Enhanced English and subject support is part of this programme and lessons are charged at an hourly rate.

BOARDING



Boarding at Kent College is a central part of school life and we welcome boarders from all over the world as well as the UK. Our boarding house is a home away from home, with a warm, friendly and family feel. Boarding is full of opportunity and our boarders are given the support to achieve academic success, grow in confidence and become a valued part of our community.

- ➔ Boarders stay in a modern purpose-built boarding house with spacious bedrooms, a large common room and fully equipped kitchens.
- ➔ Boarders share in rooms of 2, 3 or they may have their own room, some with an ensuite.
- ➔ The boarding house is run by experienced staff including a House Parent and Assistant House Parent, who are always on hand to provide encouragement, support and care.
- ➔ We have an onsite medical centre, a dedicated pastoral team and two school counsellors who are there to help with our boarders' wellbeing.
- ➔ Teachers and house tutors provide study support.
- ➔ A busy and varied after school and weekend programme is designed to be fun and relaxing as well as enable boarders to experience a British way of life. Trips and excursions take place throughout the term along with on-site workshops, cooking, crafting and cinema nights.
- ➔ Flexible exeat weekends mean boarders can choose to remain on site or leave to stay with a guardian.
- ➔ There is daily laundry and cleaning.

ACTIVITIES

Boarders have plenty of opportunities to explore the local area, learn about British culture and develop new skills.

Cultural excursions

Visits to London, the Natural History Museum, art galleries and the theatre are frequent. Kent College is close to Hever Castle, Leeds Castle and Canterbury Cathedral.

Leisure trips

Activities including ice-skating, tree-top rope courses, countryside walks to local farm shops, indoor climbing and swimming. Visits to theme parks, wildlife centres, bowling and the cinema are also popular along with a weekly shopping trip. Boarders will also go to the seaside towns including Brighton and Hastings that are an hour away from Kent College.

On-site activities

After school and at weekends, boarders can take part in a wide range of workshops that include cooking, reflexology and textiles. They can use the on site sport facilities for swimming, badminton, fitness and trampolining. In the boarding houses they enjoy movie nights with popcorn, pizza and karaoke evenings.

Celebration events

Boarders' International Evening – an opportunity to celebrate different cultures with food, a quiz and performances.

Boarders' Charity Ball – an evening of fun, dinner and a disco in aid of a school charity.

Christmas Lunch – hosted by boarders for the local community.

LOCATION AND FACILITIES

Kent College is in South East England and surrounded by 75 acres of beautiful countryside near the quiet village of Pembury.

Ten minutes away is Royal Tunbridge Wells, an historic spa town full of culture. It is a safe and wealthy town with excellent shops, independent cafes, restaurants, a theatre, arts centre and a cinema.

London is 35 minutes from Tunbridge Wells by train and beaches and seaside towns including Brighton and Hastings are one hour away. We are close to many historic attractions such as Hever Castle, which makes for a rich and varied choice of weekend excursions for boarders.

- ➔ 35 minutes to London by train



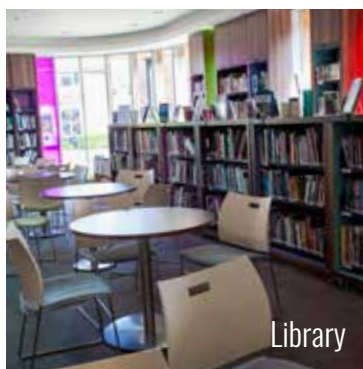


Hawkwell Place

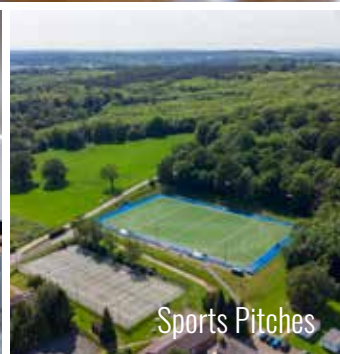

Boarding Fees 2025/2026

Fees are inclusive of VAT.

Full Boarding: £17,317 per term or £51,951 a year.

Weekly Boarding: £14,682 per term or £44,046 a year.

Short Term (1–6 weeks): Bespoke fees available.

Registration Fee: £180 (non refundable).

Deposit: £900 if applicant's parents are resident citizens of the UK/EU.

Deposit: One term's boarding fees if the applicant's parents are not resident citizens of the UK/EU.

Bursaries and Discounts

For children of Methodist families, funding may be available via the Methodist Bursary Scheme.

We offer a 20% fee reduction for Ministry of Defence service personnel.

When two or more siblings attend the school, there is a reduction of 5% of net day fees for each pupil.

English as an Additional Language 2025/2026

Standard: £460 per term.

Enhanced: £460 per term + £78 per additional one hour lesson.

Additional Information

Fees are all-inclusive and cover meals, laundry and most boarding activities.

A few boarding activities may require a small additional payment. Please budget around £100 per term.

School uniform is purchased through www.schoolblazer.com. Please budget around £400 for essential uniform.

The boarding staff can arrange transport to and from the airport or for a private visit. We use a trusted local company and all costs will be charged to your termly bill.

An immigration handing fee will be charged to your first term's bill. The cost of the visa should be paid directly to Newland Chase or to the UKVI.

Scholarships

Scholarships are open to international students at Year 7, Year 9 and Sixth Form entry. These are worth £2,000 per year and are awarded in Academic, Sport, Art, Music, Drama and Dance. Students need to have been offered a place before attending assessment days for practical scholarships.
