




Prep School

- International boarders can join from ages 8-11 (Years 4-6).
- The Prep School prepares them for a secondary school education with many Prep pupils moving into Kent College Senior School at Year 7.
- The maximum class size is 18.
- Pupils are taught by their form tutors and with specialist teachers for Music, Drama, PE and French.
- International pupils receive EAL support to help them develop their English skills.

Senior School

- Entry into the Senior School is from age 11 (Year 7) until age 16 when pupils complete GCSE examinations at the end of Year 11.
- Year 7 and Year 8 (starting ages 11-12). Pupils study a wide range of subjects taught by specialist teachers. Subjects include Maths, English, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, French, Spanish, Computer Science, Music, Drama, Art, PE and EAL. Examinations are held at the end of each year.
- Year 9 (starting age 13). Pupils continue to study a wide range of subjects and will select two language options (EAL, French, Spanish, Latin and Classics) and two creative arts options (Art, Music, Food Tech and Textiles). Examinations are held at the end of the year.
- Year 10 (starting age 14). Pupils will study a two-year GCSE programme with examinations at the end of Year 11.

Sixth Form

- Pupils join the Sixth Form at age 16 into Year 12.
- We offer a 2-year A Level or BTEC course or 3-year Sixth Form Foundation Programme.
- There are a wide range of enrichment opportunities through the KC Honours Programme.

At Kent College, we view every pupil as an individual learner with their own strengths and passions, and offer a wide range of GCSE and A Level options to meet every interest. We timetable our subjects to guarantee that a pupil's choice can be met by the school, and our results are exceptional due to the hard work of our pupils and excellence of our teaching.

2-Year GCSE (Years 10-11)

For the 2-year GCSE course pupils will take core subjects and select four further subjects from the options list, leading to 9 or 10 GCSEs.

3-Year Sixth Form Foundation

This is a flexible and individualised approach to GCSE and A Level study ideal for pupils aged 15 or 16 whose level of English may not yet be ready for A Level study or not have the GCSEs required for entry to a UK university.

SHORT TERM STUDY PROGRAMME

International pupils seeking to improve their English and experience a British education can join our short term study programme. Pupils can stay from one to six weeks for an intensive English programme, or one term to one year. We offer this in Years 7-10.

All international pupils will be integrated into mainstream lessons and have five English as a Additional Language (EAL) 35-minute lessons each week and this can be changed subject to the progress a pupil makes. They are taught EAL in one-to-one or in small groups where they can practise their English with other international pupils. All their subject lessons will be with British and International pupils and they will follow the timetable for their year group. At the end of their stay they will receive a study report.



Cultural Experience

Pupils are able to understand British culture and history through excursions to heritage sites, museums, trips to London as well as to the many local attractions.

Boarding

Short term stay pupils are usually full boarders and they are able to take advantage of all the extra clubs and activities after school and at weekends. These activities enrich their experience, allow for opportunities to interact with day and boarding pupils across the school and become involved in school life.



INTERNATIONAL STUDY CENTRE

The International Study Centre is at the heart of the school where international pupils have English as an Additional Language (EAL) lessons with a team of specialist teachers. Depending on their level of English, pupils will receive a programme of EAL support designed to help them make fast progress to access the British curriculum. Pupils are taught in small groups or one-to-one, and EAL teachers work closely with subject teachers to ensure each pupil's EAL support is tailored to help them succeed.



EAL Programmes

Standard

- Pupils will have five 35-minute lessons each week and the option to increase if more lessons are needed.
- Years 7–9: Pupils follow the mainstream curriculum and chose one language from French and Spanish.
- Years 10–13: Pupils study their chosen GCSE and A Levels. It is possible to study a reduced number of subjects at GCSE, if needed.

Enhanced

- Pupils will have as many EAL lessons as required and integrated into the mainstream curriculum when their English is at an appropriate level.

BOARDING



Boarding at Kent College is a central part of school life and we welcome boarders from all over the world as well as the UK. Our two boarding houses are a home away from home, each with a warm, friendly and family feel. Boarding at Kent College is full of opportunity and our boarders are given the support to achieve academic success, grow in confidence and become a valued part of our community.

- ➔ Two boarding houses, one for our junior boarders (ages 8–13 years) and one for our senior boarders (ages 14–18 years).
- ➔ Each house has modern facilities with spacious bedrooms, cosy common rooms with TVs and bathrooms with private shower units.
- ➔ The boarding houses are each run by an experienced staff including a house mistress, assistant housemistress, boarding assistant or resident graduate who are always on hand to provide encouragement, support and care.
- ➔ Onsite medical centre, a dedicated pastoral team and two school counsellors are there to help with our boarders' wellbeing.
- ➔ Teachers and house tutors provide study support.
- ➔ Busy and varied after school and weekend activities designed to be fun and relaxing as well as enabling boarders to experience a British way of life. Trips and excursions take place throughout the term along with on-site workshops, cooking, crafting and cinema nights.
- ➔ Flexible exeat weekends where boarders can choose to remain on site or leave to stay with a guardian.
- ➔ Daily laundry and cleaning.

ACTIVITIES

Boarders have plenty of opportunities to explore the local area, learn about British culture and develop new skills.

Cultural excursions

After school and at weekends, boarders can take part in a wide range of workshops that include cooking, reflexology and textiles. They can use the on site sport facilities for swimming, badminton, fitness and trampolining. In the boarding houses they enjoy movie nights with popcorn, pizza and karaoke evenings.


Celebration events

LOCATION AND FACILITIES

Kent College is in South East England and surrounded by 75 acres of beautiful countryside near the quiet village of Pembury.

Ten minutes away is Royal Tunbridge Wells, an historic spa town full of culture. It is a safe and wealthy town with excellent shops, independent cafes, restaurants, a theatre, arts centre and a cinema.

London is 35 minutes from Tunbridge Wells by train and beaches and seaside towns including Brighton and Hastings are one hour away. We are close to many historic attractions such as Hever Castle, which makes for a rich and varied choice of weekend excursions for boarders.



JOIN US



APPLY

Complete the online application form and submit with the Registration fee of £150. We require a current school report and a copy of the applicant's passport.



TEST

Pupils will sit computer based tests in English and Maths. These can be done at school, an agent's office or the British Council. Further tests in certain subjects to be studied at A Level will also be required.



INTERVIEW

Pupils will have an online interview with a senior member of staff where they will show their passport, talk about their interests and have the opportunity to ask questions.



OFFER

After the tests and interview we may offer a place. At this stage we will propose the appropriate EAL programme.



ACCEPT

To accept a place we need a completed acceptance form and signed contract along with the deposit.



VISA

All visa applications will be handled, at no extra cost, by Newland Chase, a global immigration service. They will manage the application and arrange appointments in your home country.



GUARDIANS

All boarders will need a guardian aged over 25 who lives within a one hour drive from Kent College.



NEW JOINER FORMS

Parents will need to complete various forms for their child including a medical questionnaire.

Standard: £350 per term.

Additional Information

Fees are all-inclusive and cover meals, laundry and most boarding activities.

A few boarding activities may require a small additional payment. Please budget around £100 per term.

School uniform is purchased through www.schoolblazer.com. Please budget around £400 for essential uniform.

The Housemistress can arrange transport to and from the airport or for a private visit. We use a trusted local company and all costs will be charged to your termly bill.

Scholarships

Scholarships are available to international students. These are worth £2,000 per year. Academic, Sport, Art, Music, Drama and Dance Scholarships are available. Students would need to have been offered a place before attending assessment days for practical scholarships.
